The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Burglary-2nd Degree-Dwelling

Minnesota Statute: 609.582.2(a)(1), with reference to: 609.582.2(a)
Maximum Sentence: 10 YEARS AND/OR \$20,000
Offense Level: Felony

Charge Description: That on or about April 14, 2015, in Minnetonka, Hennepin County, Minnesota, DAVID WILLIAM POLLARD, either directly or as an accomplice, entered a dwelling without consent, and with intent to commit a crime or committed a crime, while in the building.

Charge: Possess Pistol/Assault Weapon-Conviction or Adjudicated Delinquent for Crime of Violence

Charge Description: That on or about April 14, 2015 in minnetonka, Hennepin County, Minnesota, DAVID WILLIAM POLLARD possessed a firearm and DAVID WILLIAM POLLARD has been convicted or adjudicated delinquent in this state or elsewhere of a crime of violence, for which the sentence or court supervision expired on or after August 1, 1993.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

Beginning in June 2014, Minnetonka and 15 other police departments were investigating 26 residential burglaries in which the modus operandi was similar: at the times of the burglaries, victims were attending funerals or at the theater. In the 26 burglaries, an estimated \$300,000 worth of property, including 21 guns, was stolen.

Eden Prairie detectives reviewed surveillance video from a metro-area theater and noted the same car on two separate occasions in which the driver did not get out of the vehicle. On both dates, calls were made to theater patrons while they were at the theater and their residences were burglarized. The car was ultimately identified as a Chrysler Concorde but was registered to a person who had sold it to a buyer whose transfer was determined to be to a fictitious person.

On April 14, 2015, at about 8 p.m., Minnetonka police received a report of a burglary in progress at an address on Sussex Place, Minnetonka, Hennepin County, Minnesota. The residents of the subject address were attending a performance at a metro-area theater. Officers surrounded the address and observed a man, identified as DAVID WILLIAM POLLARD, Defendant herein, kick in the front door. Defendant then opened the garage door and drove the Chrysler automobile into the garage and closed the door.

A few minutes later, the garage door opened and the Chrysler was backed out with Defendant driving. Officers approached the car and ordered Defendant to surrender but he accelerated, endangering officers and police dogs. Defendant drove toward a squad car and swerved on to lawns to avoid a collision. The car was observed passing another squad car which joined in the pursuit. Officers observed Defendant driving at a high rate of speed, ignoring stop signs and lights, sometimes exceeding 60 MPH in a 35-MPH zone. In the vicinity of 2800 Stone Arch Road, Wayzata, Defendant jumped from the still-moving car and fled on foot. Officers pursued and a police dog found Defendant hiding under a trailer.

In a search pursuant to warrant, in Defendant's car officers recovered a suitcase filled with valuables, a handgun and in a separate box officers found silverware. All the items were identified by the burglary victims as their property taken without their consent from the subject residence.

In the course of the investigation, complainant determined that Defendant had previously been convicted of multiple crimes, including an Assault in the Second Degree, for which supervision expired in June 2007.

Defendant was arrested and remains in custody.
