NED Can you just state your uhh first, first, first and middle and full last name please?
JGS Yup Jeffrey, J-E-F-F-R-E-Y. Uh middle name Gayel, G-A-Y-E-L. Last name Stoll, S-T-O-L-L.

NED Uh.

JGS Yep, 55303.

NED Perfect. And like I said before, where this is involving the, your client, um Matthew Tuhkanen. How 'bout, how long, or can you just tell me a lil about how you're [Inaudible 00:55] uh familiar with him?

JGS Yep, I was his probation officer. Um, up, I was um, currently I was, currently I was his parole officer but I was also his probation officer on the case that he's on for. So, I've had him for an estimated about 3 years. Um the first year was, uh, for probation. Then he had a probation violation where he was sent um to initially commissioner of corrections and he was in there for estimated about close to a year. And, um, now I've had him uh out on parole. I believe he got out sometime around the summertime here.

NED Okay.

JGS Midsummer.

NED Oh, Midsummer?

JGS Yep, 2018.

NED Okay.

NED Do you know what he was in for the last time?

JGS It was assault 5th degree is what his a charge was.

NED Okay, assault 5th degree. How often have you, did you have interactions with him?

JGS Uh, quite a bit. He was in the office a, for office visits um or home visits back when we had an address for uh about once a week on average.

NED Once a week. Okay. And then uh how was he during those visits?

JGS He, uh he had uh some violations. He, um yeah, I mean he showed up to visits but he had a, about I believe four violations since August.

NED What Violations?

JGS For parole, for parole violations, yes.

NED Okay. And is that basically some of the reasons, I believe that he had some warrants then out of Anoka County I think?

JGS He, he did have some warrants out of Anoka County...

JGS Uh, not necessarily, um one was for trespass which is a little different uh, uh crime. I believe this last one he had some of them. Was um I believe would be for not showing up to court. There wasn't a parole a violation warrant. It was uh, uh something through the courts, on a case that was still pending.

NED Okay. [Inaudible background voice 02:37] Uh, did he have any drug issues in the past, er, that you are aware of?

JGS Ah yup, ye-uh, some violations resulted in from uh drug use. Methamphetamine.

NED Methamphetamine? Okay, that was my next question. Just only methamphetamine? Nothing else?

JGS Uh and then ah yes, that is only it. Yep.

JGS That is correct.

NED And then it was out during the course then the la-, within the last three years or the last...?

JGS Um he [inaudible 03:18] himself uh admitted that. You know he had some uh mental health things uh um to deal with. But he had gone through treatment while MICD treatment while out with me so taking care of the chemical as well as the mental health um issues through treatment.

JGS Uh, no, not really.

NED No suicidal thoughts or anything like that never talked a...
