COMPLAINT

Order of Detention

The Complainant submits this complaint to the Court and states that there is probable cause to believe Defendant committed the following offense(s):

COUNT I

Charge: Murder - 2nd Degree - With Intent-Not Premeditated

Minnesota Statute: 609.19.1(1), with reference to: 609.11.4, 609.19.1, 609.11.9

Maximum Sentence: Forty years.

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 09/27/2021

Control #(ICR#): 21008876

Charge Description: That on or about September 27, 2021, in Hennepin County, Minnesota, NASRI AHMED ABDILAH, caused the death of S.F., a human being, with intent to effect the death of that person or another, but without premeditation, while using a dangerous weapon.

Minimum Sentence: 1 YEAR AND 1 DAY

COUNT II

Charge: Fleeing a Peace Officer in a Motor Vehicle

Minnesota Statute: 609.487.3, with reference to: 609.487.3

Maximum Sentence: 3 YEARS AND 1 DAY AND/OR \$5,000

Offense Level: Felony

Offense Date (on or about): 09/27/2021

Control #(ICR#): 21008876

Charge Description: That on or about September 27, 2021, in Hennepin County, Minnesota, NASRI AHMED ABDILAH did by means of a motor vehicle, flee or attempt to flee from a peace officer acting in the lawful discharge of an official duty, who NASRI AHMED ABDILAH knew or reasonably should have known was a peace officer.

STATEMENT OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Complainant has investigated the facts and circumstances of this offense and believes the following establishes probable cause:

On or about September 27, 2021, at approximately 9:45 a.m., officers with the Bloomington Police Department were dispatched to Nicollet Court Apartments located at 8916 Nicollet Avenue South on the report of a male dragging a female's body through the parking lot of an apartment complex and throwing the body in a dumpster. Upon arrival, several witnesses pointed officers to the area of the dumpster. Officers observed a blood trail leading up to the dumpster. Officers looked inside the dumpster and observed the adult female victim S.F. unresponsive and bloody inside the dumpster. Officers observed that the victim was deceased and had significant trauma to her face and upper body area. The medical examiner informed officers that the victim was stabbed several times in the neck and suffered significant blunt force trauma.

Officers spoke to witness F.B. F.B. informed officers she was a resident at the apartment complex. F.B. was looking out her window when she observed a male who was subsequently identified as NASRI AHMED ABDILAH, Defendant herein, dragging an unresponsive female through the parking lot. F.B. began yelling out the window, "What are you doing?" and yelling for help. F.B. observed Defendant dump the victim's body in the dumpster. F.B. then called 911. F.B. then saw Defendant drive by in his vehicle and pointed Defendant out to officers.

Officers spoke to witnesses R.R. and D.Z. Witnesses R.R. and D.Z. informed officers that they work as building maintenance for the apartment complex. Both witnesses were in the maintenance shed which is approximately 15 feet from the dumpster. Witnesses R.R. and D.Z. heard a loud "thud" in the dumpster. Witnesses R.R. and D.Z. then heard a resident yelling about someone dragging a body to the dumpster. Witness D.Z. saw Defendant walk away from the dumpster. Witness R.R. and D.Z. looked in the dumpster and saw the victim. Witness R.R. then called 911. Witness D.Z. pointed out the blood trail and drag marks to officers. Officers followed the blood trail and drag marks from the dumpster to the victim's residence. Inside the victim's residence, officers observed a large pool of blood and a knife laying in the pool of blood.

Several other witnesses who were identified as residents in the apartment complex, informed officers that around 9:00 a.m. they heard a female screaming for help and heard loud banging noises. However, when they looked out their apartments, they did not observe anything.

While at the scene, Defendant drove by in his vehicle. Several witnesses identified Defendant as the male who threw the victim's body into the dumpster. Officers attempted to stop Defendant. Defendant fled from officers in his vehicle and crashed into a marked squad car that was parked at the entrance to the apartment complex. Defendant then continued to flee from officers in his vehicle. Several officers pursued Defendant in their marked squad cars with lights and sirens activated. Defendant led officers on a high-speed chase. During the pursuit, Defendant was traveling approximately 70 m.p.h. in 35 m.p.h. zone. The high speed chase ended in Minneapolis when officers completed a PIT maneuver on Defendant's vehicle. Defendant was apprehended and officers observed Defendant had blood on his body, clothing, and sandals. Inside Defendant's vehicle, officers discovered an infant child.

Through the course of the investigation, officers learned that the victim and Defendant were involved in a significant romantic relationship and lived together at the residence. Officers also learned that the infant found in Defendant's vehicle after the pursuit was the victim's and Defendant's child they share-in-common.

Officers spoke to family of the victim and Defendant. The family informed officers Defendant suffers with

mental health issues.

Defendant is in custody.

SIGNATURES AND APPROVALS

Complainant requests that Defendant, subject to bail or conditions of release, be:
(1) arrested or that other lawful steps be taken to obtain Defendant's appearance in court; or
(2) detained, if already in custody, pending further proceedings; and that said Defendant otherwise be dealt with according to law.
